Local Beaches

Enjoy Tralee Bay and its wonderful nearby beaches which offer locals and visitors a welcome break from the hustle-and-bustle of urban life. Take in the magnificent scenery and breathe in the fresh Wild Atlantic air to calm the mind and relax the senses.



Banna Beach 12km northwest of Tralee is world renowned for its miles of sandy beaches and famous sand dunes. It is a beautiful Blue Flag beach that extends for miles and is a walkers paradise. It is popular for swimming, surfing, walking, sunbathing and relaxing.

Fenit 10km north of Tralee offers stunning scenic walks on the harbour, pier, marina, Fenit island and path to the diving boards. Famous for sailing, swimming and angling. A trip to St Brendan Heritage Centre on the edge of the pier is a must!



Derrymore 14.8km west of Tralee is a stunning sandy beach which lies between the Slieve Mish mountains and the Atlantic ocean. Popular for walking and swimming.

Ballyheighue 18km north of Tralee is the gateway to the scenic Kerry Head. It offers 10 kilometers of golden sandy beach looking out over Tralee Bay. Great for swimming, surfing, walking and watersports.

Castlegregory 25km west of Tralee is located at the foot of a sandy peninsula called the Maherees renowned for spectacular lengthy sandy beaches. Popular for all types of watersports including scuba diving and snorkelling.



Inch 31.3km west of Tralee is one of the most beautiful beaches in Ireland where many surfers and beach lovers find their fun. This 5km beach is a terrific spot to watch surfers.

Ballybunion 32.5km north of Tralee is famous for its dramatic cliffs, sandy beaches and world renowned seaweed baths. Surrounded by rocky headlands, high cliffs and caves you can explore and walk at low tide.

Local Walks & Trails

Tralee and its surrounds offer an incredible choice of walks, strolls, trails, hikes and climbs to choose from. Enjoy unspoilt views of amazing countryside while savouring the invigorating sea air from the Atlantic ocean.



Tralee Town Park in the centre of Tralee, is a magnificent 35 acre park where you can enjoy a lovely leisurely stroll amongst the beautiful roses, mature trees and foliage. The Rose walk within the park gives an insight into the famous Rose of Tralee festival.

Tralee Bay Canal is a picturesque walk which runs from the Marina Apartments right out to Tralee Bay. With stunning views and diverse wildlife the canal is a haven for otters, herons and swans.



River Lee Nature Walk is a leisurely walk along the northern bank of the river Lee. It extends from Castlemorris as far as the Aqua Dome in the opposite direction. A nice extension of this walk is to walk around the lake at the Tralee Bay Wetlands centre.

Ballyseedy Woods is 2km southeast of Tralee and is a stunning recreational amenity. It is a unique and tranquil retreat which extends to nearly 80 acres. Look out for the majestic Ash, Oak and Beech trees that have been growing there for centuries.



Glanageenty 13km east of Tralee features 3 walking routes in a remote valley located in Ballymacelligott. Ideal for families and advanced walkers. It is one of Kerry's hidden gems.

Glanteenassig 28.4km west of Tralee is off the beaten track from Aughacashla. Travel up the valley to feel the remoteness of the mountains behind. The area abounds with streams, lakes, waterfalls and dramatic cliffs which characterises the untamed landscape.

North Kerry Way is a 48km linear walking route through the northern park of County Kerry starting in Tralee and ending in Ballyheigue. The terrain consists of mainly quiet country roads, firm beach and sand tracks, bog roads and field paths.



Kerry Camino is a walk modelled on the Camino de Santiago in Northern Spain. It follows a route from Tralee to Dingle which has some of the most dramatic scenery and coastline in Ireland.
