THE CABLE

Historical Background

The Transatlantic Cable, which ran from Valentia Island, Co. Kerry, to Heart's Content, Newfoundland, spanned over 3,000 kilometres beneath the Atlantic Ocean and revolutionised global communication by reducing message transmission across continents from weeks to mere minutes. As the world changed forever, so too did the lives of those at its edges — a truth brought vividly to life in this stirring production.

Set against the backdrop of the monumental laying of the Transatlantic Cable on Valentia Island in 1866 — known as the “Eighth Wonder of the World” — The Cable explores how a family's emotional struggles mirror a world on the brink of a communications revolution.

Show Synopsis

The Transatlantic Cable is about to be laid out from Valentia Island in South Kerry to Newfoundland, changing how the world communicates forever. But for the local O'Sullivan family, whose son Mícheál works at the cable station, will this bring any comfort as they desperately seek news about their daughter, Kitty, who sailed out to New York six months earlier? Kelly has written a compelling story about loss, love, and life at an extraordinary time in Irish history. *The Cable* is deeply moving, funny and will live long in the memory.

The Cable is a poignant exploration of loss, hope, and the universal longing for connection. Blending the compelling visual storytelling shaped by Mike Kelly with haunting original music by Dave McGilton, evocative lighting design by John Hurley, and the creative direction of Aidan Dooley, *The Cable* captures the intersection of technological achievement and human longing.

Audiences can expect a theatrical experience that stirs the soul and ignites the imagination — a compelling narrative of personal and historical transformation set against one of Ireland's most dramatic landscapes — a story that deeply resonates.

Mike Kelly, Playwright & Performer

Mike Kelly trained at the prestigious London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA) and has appeared in countless stage productions since. He spent 15 years touring the UK, Ireland and mainland Europe with Madhouse Theatre Company, of which he is a co-founder.

Their repertoire ranged from the intense prison drama 'Someone Who'll Watch Over Me' by Frank McGuinness to their take on the hilarious 'Complete Works of Shakespeare (abridged)'. He also played the lead in a national tour of 'Look Back In Anger'. TV credits include 'The Martian' (Dir. Ridley Scott), Hellboy II (Dir. Guillermo Del Toro), a guest lead in 'Silent Witness' and 'Robin Hood' for the BBC, and 'The Terror' for AMC, with Ciaran Hinds. 'The Cable' is Mike's debut at Siamsa Tíre.

Mike has spent his life visiting the family home in Ballinskelligs, Southwest Kerry, just a few miles from Valentia Island. His love for the place runs deep and it has always been where he is most creatively fulfilled and inspired.



Aidan Dooley, Director & Dramaturg

Aidan is originally from Galway and trained at the Guildford School of Acting. Based in London, he works as a freelance actor, writer, and director. His theatre credits include Philadelphia, Here I Come! (Wyndham's), Elegies for Angels (Criterion), DA (White Bear), Translations (National Theatre), and national tours with

the Bristol Old Vic Theatre Company. He has also performed at the Fuse Festival, with Eastern Angles, and Red Kettle Theatre.

He is best known for his internationally acclaimed solo show *Tom Crean – Antarctic Explorer*, which has toured worldwide for over 20 years, winning awards including a Fringe First at Edinburgh and Best Solo Show at the New York Festival. [tomcreanshow.com] His second solo show, *Our Last Chieftain – O'Sullivan Beara*, also toured extensively.

Aidan is Co-Artistic Director of Play On Words Theatre Company and has been an Associate Lecturer in Drama at Canterbury Christ Church University since 2006. His book *Travels with Tom Crean* was published in 2016.

Before her appointment as CEO of Siamsa Tíre, Angela Ryan Whyte built a distinguished career as an award-winning theatre producer, playwright, and actor. Holding an Honours MA in Drama & Theatre Studies from NUI Galway, she founded Jasango Theatre and Scripts – Ireland’s Playwriting Festival, producing acclaimed works and mentoring emerging voices in collaboration with national partners The Abbey Theatre & Fishamble. An accomplished arts facilitator and curator, she led national and international tours, youth theatre projects, and large-scale cultural events, all rooted in inclusive, community-focused practice and a passion for Irish theatre and storytelling.

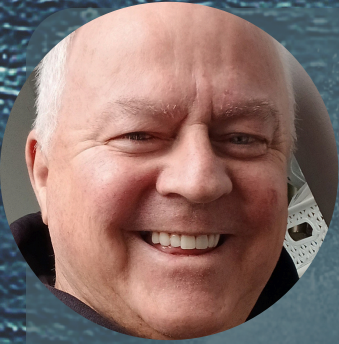


Miriam Cooper - Assistant Director
